CONFERENCE MANUAL

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CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME

The Mid-America Men's Volleyball Intercollegiate Conference (MAMVIC) will be split into three separate divisions: East, West and National for 2012.

ARTICLE II - MISSION

The mission of the conference shall be to promote the positive ideals and objectives of athletics, to provide an organization of colleges with similar foundations to engage in athletic contests on an equal basis, to serve as a forum to formulate guidelines and solve common problems, to enhance and preserve athletics in their true perspective, to promote athletics in an academic environment. This conference shall facilitate the purposes of intercollegiate sports and further the learning goals of its member institutions.

ARTICLE IV - NEW MEMBERS

Institutions that want to join the MAMVIC will have to submit a request to do so in writing to the Conference Commissioner. These requests must be submitted on or before March 1st, prior to the first year of competition. The conference athletic directors will vote on allowing the new membership (2/3 majority required). Any request to join the conference after March 1st, will be discussed, but may lead to special conditions prior to acceptance.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers and Division Chairpersons

Section 2. Term of Office

The terms of office for the above named division chairpersons shall be for two years from the date of their election, at a conference meeting. New chairpersons will be elected to serve each subsequent two years. Any chairperson may be removed by a majority vote of their divisional institutions.

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. Membership

The MAMVIC Executive committee is made up of the Conference Commissioner, the Assistant Commissioner and the Conference SID.

Section 2. Jurisdiction

The MAMVIC Executive committee will act and make decisions at all times in the best interest of the conference. The committee has power to act in all Conference matters covered by the Constitution and bylaws; provided these matters are submitted in writing by the official institutional representative of a member institution to the Conference Commissioner.

Section 3. Appeals

If and when the committee rules against any member of the conference, the affected member has the right to appeal the executive decision to the conference as a whole. Appeal hearings shall be decided by a 2/3 majority vote of the athletic directors of the conference.

If a scheduled time is made to vote on appeal, there must be 60% of the conference representation to rule on any appeal. (this includes conference calls and tournament coaches meetings)

All coaching members of the conference are able to voice concerns or contribute information to the conference Commissioner at any time. Areas of concern are to be discussed at the conference meeting, which takes place at the conference tournament, or by means of a conference call.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES

Section 1. Responsibility of the Conference Commissioner:

The conference shall hire a Commissioner to serve as the executive officer of the conference. The conference Commissioner shall receive, inspect, and file all reports required by the bylaws. The conference Commissioner shall keep the conference records and makes annual reports.

Section 2. Responsibilities of the MAMVIC Sports Information Director:

The MAMVIC SID compiles all statistics and league standings from the conference and submits them to web-site and other national volleyball publications. The SID will update the conference standings and statistics and a listing of conference player of the week available to the member institutions.

Section 3. Responsibilities of the Conference Assistant Commissioner:

The conference Assistant Commissioner shall be an athletic director selected from an institution in a MAMVIC division different from that of the Commissioner. The Assistant Commissioner shall advise the Commissioner on matters pertaining to all aspects of running the conference.

Section 4. Responsibilities of the Conference Divisional Chairpersons:

The conference Divisional Chairpersons shall take minutes at their conference divisional meeting, and send the minutes to each divisional member institution and the MAMVIC Commissioner. The conference Divisional Chairpersons will represent their division on the NAIA National Ratings Committee.

ARTICLE VIII - CONFERENCE COMMISSIONER

The administrative head of the Conference shall be a commissioner whose original employment shall be by a contract approved by the affirmative vote of not less than three quarters of the member institutions voting by their respective Executive Council members and whose re-employment shall be by contract approved by the affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the member institutions voting the same way.

Responsibilities:

- Through the office, have the responsibility of enforcing all conference bylaws. This responsibility shall include, but not be limited to, broad discretionary powers to conduct investigations, hold hearings and to impose

temporary and permanent measures against member universities, their personnel, and student-athletes for conduct judged to be in violation of the spirit as well as the letter of conference bylaws. Approval of such measures of the Conference Commissioner must be obtained from the Executive Council.

- Serve as treasurer of the conference and handle receipts and disbursements of conference funds, keep accounts and present an audited account to the Executive Council of all financial transactions at the end of the year.
- Maintenance of conference records and files.
- Serve as an ex-officio, non-voting member and secretary of the Executive Council and the NAIA National Ratings Committee, as well as any other established committees.
- Maintain appropriate relations with the media in order to achieve a continuing education program on behalf of scholarship, sportsmanship and understanding of the value of competitive athletics in accordance with the ethics and ideals which motivate the MAMVIC in its conduct of intercollegiate Men's Volleyball.
- Negotiate agreements on behalf of the Conference with sponsors, radio and television networks, sports arenas and other parties as required by the Conference, provided, however, the Commissioner shall have no authority to bind the Conference by such agreements unless first approved by the Executive Council.
- Attend national meetings as deemed necessary to keep the conference informed of major athletic developments
- Communication on behalf of the conference and to conference members as necessary.
- Supervision of the conference Sports Information Director
- Preparation, procurement, and presentation of conference trophies and awards.
- Declaration of forfeits in contests, in accordance with conference regulations.
- This position may be paid a stipend of \$ ___ per year that will be paid in two installments of \$ ___ February 15 and April 15 of the year of employment.

ARTICLE IX - MEETINGS

Section 1. Meetings

There will be a conference coaches meeting each year at each conference divisional tournament. Areas of concern should be submitted to the divisional chairperson and MAMVIC Commissioner one (1) week prior to the meeting so he/she and the conference commissioner can make an agenda for the meeting. The site of the meeting is to be arranged by the host institution of the conference tournament

Section 2. Conference Call

Conference calls or special meetings can be called upon by the Conference Commissioner at any time. This may happen if there needs to be a vote taken within the conference.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the constitution may be made only at a conference meeting by a 2/3 vote. The institution must send the proposed change to the conference chairperson at least one week before the meeting.

ARTICLE XI - CONFERENCE DUES

Section 1. Initial Fees \$400

The conference dues for the season are to be paid by September 30th.

Section 2. New members \$800

Institutions that were not a member of the MAMVIC in the preceding season, will pay a \$800 due the first year. At the annual conference meeting the new member institution will be evaluated. If the new member institution has acted in compliance with the MAMVIC conference regulations, an amount of \$400 will be submitted to the following year's dues for that institution.

Use of Conference dues: The conference dues will be spent on the following:

- 1). End of season and conference tournaments awards (40% max)
- 2). Sports Information Director (20% max)
- 3). Travel, supplies, postage, etc as required for the day-to-day operation of the conference.

ARTICLE XII - FREQUENCY OF PLAY

Section 1. Frequency of Play

The maximum number of varsity playing dates (calendar days) an institution may schedule is 28. Further, no student may compete on more than 28 playing dates (this includes: varsity, junior varsity, freshman, etc.) during a sport season in an academic year. NAIA approved post-season participation is excluded from this regulation. An alumni game is considered by the NAIA to be an in-house event and shall be treated the same as an internal practice.

- a. In addition, each institution is allowed no more than two scrimmages beyond the 28 allowable varsity playing dates an institution may schedule or in which a student may compete.
- b. Every conference member will have to schedule two matches with every other member of your conference, as demanded by conference regulations. Failure to do so will result in a forfeit
- c. An institution which does not schedule or participate in the maximum

number of allowable varsity playing dates (28) may conduct additional scrimmages to fulfill the allowable number, so long as the total number of varsity playing dates (28) and scrimmages (2) does not exceed 30 and the total number of scrimmages dates does not exceed five (5)

- d. Every institution will have to play a minimum of 12 matches against varsity NAIA opponents.
- e. A maximum of two approved matches against teams from foreign countries excluding Canada and Mexico played in the United States and/or Canada/Mexico will be permitted without counting against the maximum allowable number. Approved contest held in a foreign country (except Canada and Mexico) will not apply to the limitation.
- f. Each member institution shall have a maximum 24-week practice and competition season established by each member institution. There shall be no more than two break periods during the 24 weeks. NAIA approved post-season participation shall not be counted as part of the 24-week period.
 - *A week is defined as Sunday (12:01 a.m.) through Saturday (1:59 p.m.). Any practice or competition during this period shall constitute one of the 24 weeks permitted.*
 - *A Practice is defined as an activity organized and/or directed by an identified member or the coaching staff of that sport in which appropriate equipment is used, or instruction and/or evaluation of the athlete takes place.*
 - *Conditioning and weight-training activities that do not utilize equipment associated with a sport will not be considered practice in that sport.*
 - *A college activities class involving the teaching of sports skills which is open to all students will not be considered practice. A college activities class involving the teaching of sport skills open only to invited students shall apply to the practice/competition season of the sport.*

Section 2. Scheduling

Every member will have to schedule 2 matches with each other member in its own conference division.

ARTICLE XIII - PLAYING RULES

PLAYING RULES: NAIA Men's Volleyball will use the NCAA Men's Volleyball Rules, with unlimited substitutions as the only NAIA modification.

The NCAA Men's Rules are The 2011-2013 USA Volleyball Indoor Rules

NCAA modifications for 2012 will include:

1. Modification #1 involves television timeouts, we do not expect this to affect any NAIA matches at this time.
2. The libero can be changed each set.
3. The scoring format will be the best three-out-of-five format (rally scoring) with the first four sets played to 25 points and the fifth set played to 15 points. All sets must be won by two points.
4. There will be a technical timeout when the first team reaches 15 points in sets one through four. In the fifth set, each team will receive two timeouts. There will be a technical timeout when the first team reaches eight points. All timeouts will be one minute in length. The technical timeout will be canceled if either team calls a timeout before the first team reaching 15 points in sets one through four or eight points in set five.
5. The international pursuit rule will be used.
6. Maximum six substitutions per set (NCAA Modification). (NAIA will use unlimited substitutions)

ARTICLE XIV - MATCH PROTOCOL

MAMVIC PreMatch Protocol will be available as an addendum to this document.

ARTICLE XV - ELIGIBILITY

Section 1. We are using the same NAIA eligibility rules that all of the other NAIA sports at your university use. Please have your Registrar fill out an NAIA Official Eligibility Certificate, Entering Freshman Eligibility Certificate, NAIA Certificate of Clearance and (when necessary) a Transfer Player Eligibility Statement. Make sure that all necessary signatures are on every document.

If you have a new player who would require the Competitive Experience Outside Intercollegiate Athletics form, please include that.

Section 2. Completed forms should be mailed, faxed or e-mailed to me at the Conference Commissioner, prior to your first competition or scrimmage.
FAILURE TO SUBMIT ELIGIBILITY FORMS CAN RESULT IN FORFEITS.

Section 3. Ineligible Players

Any member school using a player ruled ineligible shall forfeit all games in the current academic year in which the ineligible player has participated. The games which are forfeited shall be credited as games won by the team to which the games have been forfeited. All statistics from the match shall stand. Only the score and outcome is subject to change.

Section 4. Hardships or Exceptions to a rule

Any request for a hardship, Appeal of an Eligibility Ruling or Exception to a Standing NAIA Rule should be sent to me using the official NAIA forms located at: <http://naia.cstv.com/member-services/legislative/eligibility.htm> The commissioner, assistant commissioner and one athletic director from outside your MAMVIC Division will review any request and make a decision. Decisions on these issues will not be immediate, allow time for research and discussion on our part. Make any requests in a timely manner.

ARTICLE XVI - FORFEIT

Section 1.

Athletic contest regularly scheduled between two member institutions and canceled by one without consent or approval of the other may be declared a forfeit. If a contest has to be canceled due to inclement weather, all efforts have to be made by the involved institutions to make up the match(es).

ARTICLE XVII - CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

Tournament Format:

Each MAMVIC conference divisional tournament will rotate on a yearly basis - Conference tournament dates will be set at the previous year's conference tournament coaches meeting. The conference tournament will take place two weeks before the NAIA National Invitational Tournament, as long as Easter does not fall in that particular weekend.

As soon as each institution has played their last regular season home game they must fax the sports information director their final statistics for all categories, and their final record (conference and overall). The sports information director will then compile a packet of information with standings and notification of first round opponents and will provide that information to each institution.

The host institution is responsible for all aspects of contest management including

- scheduling, hiring officials, statisticians, support staff, concessions, etc. The host institution is financially responsible for all costs except - every participating team will have to pay a fee (maximum of \$12) for each player's meal at the tournament banquet. The host institution shall also oversee a conference banquet to be held after play on Friday. Conference awards will be presented at this banquet and the coaches meeting will be before or after the banquet.

The host institution must have a warm up area available for teams scheduled to play in the next game. Locker room and training room availability must be provided for each participating member institution. A minimum of 20 balls must be supplied for the warm-ups.

ARTICLE XVIII - CONFERENCE AWARDS

The conference will offer the following awards:

- Regular Season Conference Champion
- Conference Tournament Champion
- Coach of the year
- Newcomer/Freshman of the year
- Defensive player of the year
- Conference Most Valuable Player
- First Team All-Conference
- Second Team All-Conference
- Honorable Mention All-Conference
- Academic All-Conference

Conference Coach of the Year

Coach of the year will be voted on by the coaches and no coach can vote for

themselves. This award will be based upon regular season play. Voting will be done at the same time as the all conference selections. If there is a tie in the voting, the voting will go to a second round with only the two relevant nominations.

Regular season all conference team and MVP voting

The conference chairperson will send all schools a ballot to vote. Each coach must nominate four players in rank order 1 - 4. The conference chairperson will list all the teams and the players that were nominated by their coaches and then submit a list of players along with stats to all the schools in which coaches must vote for 1 -15 players. The top vote getter will become the conference MVP, vote getters 2 - 7 will become first team all conference selections, vote getters 8 - 13 will be awarded second team all conference recognition, and vote getters 14 - 25 will earn honorable mention honors. Coaches may not vote for their own players. Only Conference Statistics will be used in voting

Academic All Conference Team

Coaches will submit the names of all players on their team who have passed a minimum of 24 credit hours at the institution and hold a cumulative grad point average of 3.25 or above. Grades must be verified by the schools registrar. All varsity players can only be considered for this award.

Newcomer/Freshman of the Year

Coaches will nominate one player who is an academic freshman or transfer. Coaches will be voting on the nominations. Coaches cannot vote for their own players

Defensive Player of the Year

A player that has played most of the season as a Libero or defensive specialist. Coaches will nominate one player that filled this role for the team. Coaches will be voting on the nominations. Coaches cannot vote for their own players.

ARTICLE XIX - CONFERENCE SEEDING

1. Regular season conference play will determine the MAMVIC regular season champion and the seeding for the conference tournament. In case of a tie between two teams in first place, both teams will be honored as co-champions.
2. All Institutions will advance to conference tournament play.
3. Should a tie exist, the following procedure will be used :
 - a. Overall MAMVIC record percentage
 - b. Match record - head to head
 - c. Game record - head to head
 - d. Game record - overall

- e. Point differential - head to head
- f. Point differential - overall
- g. Overall match record percentage
- h. Coin toss

If a team is eliminated from the tie when a tie exists between three or more teams, go back to the top of the list to determine the tie breaker between the remaining teams.

ARTICLE XX - REPORTING STATISTICS

Every Monday beginning on the last Monday of January and continuing through the last Monday before the conference tournament, each member institution must report their teams statistics to the Sports Information Director.

*** If a school is negligent in reporting their scores and statistics each Monday before noon to the conference SID, the conference statistics will still be compiled and a note shall indicate which school did not report scores. If a school is negligent in reporting their scores or statistics twice during the season then no players from that institution shall be eligible for all conference recognition. If a school is late in reporting their scores or statistics three times then once again no players from that school will be eligible for all conference recognition. Please have them in no later than 9:00 am.**

1. Statistics are required weekly to post statistical leaders in the conference, and all conference nominations.
2. Statistics should be faxed or e-mailed to the MAMVIC Sports Information Director
3. All statistics are calculated by games played, not matches.
4. Total attempts (TA) are the sum total of all attempts within a category
5. If statistics are being kept during the match it is recommended that a crew of two (2) or more people be used due to the speed of the game.
6. Upon entering a game that player is credited for a game played whether there is statistical information or not.
7. Categories for statistics: attack, assist, serve, dig, block

ARTICLE XXI - SANCTIONS

Member Institutions that not meet the requirements as outlined in this manual or do not meet the deadlines as specified, will not qualify for any conference awards or conference post-season playoffs. The conference Commissioner will notify the institution when the sanctions are applied. The institution will have 14 calendar days after notification to appeal the decision.
